NOTICE OF CDBG-DR SUBSTANTIAL AMENDMENT TO THE ACTION PLAN AVAILABILITY

The Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) announces the availability of the Substantial Amendment to the Community Development Block Grant Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) Action Plan. The initial Action Plan was written to program \$71,931,000 (\$59,898,000 for 2020 (FR-6303) and \$12,033,000 for 2021 (FR-6326)) the MEDC received to support the long-term recovery and mitigation efforts from the 2020 and 2021 severe storms and flooding (DR-4547 and DR-4607) and was approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) on January 20, 2023. The funding was allocated by congress through the Disaster Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2022 (Pub. L. 117-43).

In January 2023, HUD allocated an additional \$7,864,000 to the MEDC. This substantial amendment to the Action Plan is the MEDC's application and distribution plan for the additional allocation passed by congress as the Continuing Appropriations Act of 2023 (Pub. L. 117–180). This substantial amendment also clarifies certain details of the Infrastructure and Public Facilities and Planning Programs.
